Insidious Guiles

Dear parishioners and friends of San Francesco Church,

After over 20 years, I still remember a peculiar confession of a pious woman who had been fooled by Satan. She confessed that, on a first Saturday, she had gone from a quick run to the store back home to assist her sick daughter, rather than going to church to keep her Five First Saturdays devotion uninterrupted. It was not easy for me to convince her that she had made the right decision. Had she instead spent an hour or so in church fulfilling the prescribed requirements of the Five First Saturdays, she would have been committing the rather serious sin of neglecting her daughter's needs!

This article is on warning you about the guiles used by the devil to fool and mislead his favorite target: pious, devout people. The devil was an angel of light (Lucifer) who fell from grace because he refused to be humble and to serve. None of us can match his acumen. He knows that pious people would not fall for doing something patently sinful. Hence, he first points out to devout souls how pleasantly satisfied they felt at the end of a particularly rewarding devotion. As he makes sure that they keep faithful observance of that devotion, he might reinforce their desire by following that with a subtle mention of how people in church noticed their piety and devotion. At strategic intervals, he also reminds them that such and such a saint had the same devotion. Satan's intention, of course, is to deceive them into thinking that they too are on the right path to sainthood. If, for whatever reason, next time they encounter some difficulties in keeping their streak of devotions going, undoubtedly, Satan will try his best to remind them that they have a reputation of holiness to protect.

My dear friends in Christ, between the consequences of original sin and our innate hubris, we do not stand a chance! We ought to resort to what Jesus did when tempted by Satan: we shall resort to God's Word! Hence, it becomes incredibly simple to sort things out and to make the right choice. God's Word assures us that, on Judgement Day, we will be judged on whether or not we attended to Jesus' needs as he drew close to us in the least and the neediest of our brothers and sisters: (cf. Matthew 25: 31-46).

With the help of the Holy Spirit, once we have established a solid praver life and we attend Holy Mass on Sunday, the rest of the time meant for our activities, we should spend carrying out the work assigned to us and also joyously attending to the needs of all the people the Lord has placed in our life. Only if we are confident of having sufficient time to meet our obligations, rather than instead of, we should go to church on weekdays. Actually, if my reading of God's will is correct, I would recommend that we draw close and spend quality time mainly with those people with whom we would not choose to "waste" our precious time. And if it becomes evident that we are the only ones left to assist someone living alone, ailing in some ways, and/or aging, the Lord is asking us to stay joyfully with that person rather than going to Mass on Sunday! In such an extreme case, being with that person might be the only sacrifice acceptable to the Lord.

Obviously, the "least" of our brothers and sisters the Lord places in our lives and who clamor for our care, includes more than just the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the ill, and incarcerated mentioned in the gospel segment about Judgment Day.

However, the voice of the Holy Spirit can be softer than the voice of Satan. Hence, if we ignore his voice, we would not experience the joy that he reserves for those who choose to inconvenience themselves and attend to the needs of the least of their brothers and sisters.

Devotions such as First Fridays, the Five First Saturdays, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, various Novenas and so on, even hours of adoration before the Blessed Sacrament are not offered by Mother Church mainly for our personal satisfaction. They are offered so that we find inspiration and motivation to be able to attend to the needs of the least, including those we would rather stay away from or spend only a token amount of time with to silence our conscience.

Providentially, if we observe our favorite devotions in a careful listening mode, the Lord will make it unmistakably clear that we cannot delegate our share of love and care to anybody else. On Judgment Day, we would not be able to say that *Visiting Angels* or *A place for Mom* fulfilled our obligation towards people who made many sacrifices for us. Nor will we be able to say that we were busy doing more important things.

Hopefully, a long time before Judgment Day, we would have listened to the soft voice of the Holy Spirit and it would have dawned on us that absolutely nothing else could have been as important as spending a generous portion of time with the Lord in his many and, often, inconvenient disguises.

But since we do not know when the Lord will call us in death, if we are wise and prudent, we would resolve this very moment not to waste a single opportunity to fill our quota of loving and caring for the Lord "horizontally," by loving and caring for him in any of his many disguises.


