God Wants to "Need" Us

Dear Parishioners and Friends of San Francesco Church, Whenever we feel completely distraught and at a loss for the many ways people tend to mess things up, especially at higher levels where the pain is more intense and more widespread, as believers we might be tempted to imagine how the world would be if entrusted again solely to the hands of our Creator God as it was when he stepped back after completing his creation and admired his stupendous handiwork: God looked at everything he had made, and he found it very good. Evening came, and

morning followed-- the sixth day. Genesis 1:31

However, with complete foreknowledge, the Lord God entrusted his magnificent and flawless creation to the hands of the human beings he had formed from the dirt of the earth. Then the Lord God said: "Let us make human beings in our image, after our likeness. Let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, and the cattle, and over all the wild animals and all the creatures that crawl on the ground." Genesis 1:26

Reflecting on this decision that seems bold even for God, the Psalmist wonders: What are humans that you are mindful of them, mere mortals that you care for them? Yet you have made them little less than a god, crowned them with glory and honor. You have given them rule over the works of your hands, put all things at their feet: Psalm 8:5-7

The Old Testament doesn't hide the flaws of Israel's most prominent leaders, prophets, kings, and heads of dynasties. Actually, their mistakes are reported in disturbing detail and are contrasted with the feats of the humblest, lowliest members of Israel whom Yahweh commissioned to carry out his most important missions.

We would think that in the New Testament, Jesus, God in human flesh, with direct knowledge of how weak human nature truly is would have changed the divine MO, but he didn't! After a whole night spent in prayer to the Father (cf. Luke 6:12), he chose twelve from among his disciples. Humanly speaking, Jesus did a poor job! To lead this mottled "elite group", he picked Simon Peter, a natural bragger, overconfident, easily scared fisherman who would deny knowing him three times. He also picked James and John whom he nicknamed *Boanerges* for their fiery, quick temper; Matthew, a tax collector, sold to the hated Roman occupiers; even a terrorist by the name

of Simon, the Zealot and, of course, Judas who would betray him. In spite of having the best of teachers, Jesus's Apostles proved to be a slow learning, narrow-minded, set in their way, easily scared bunch. Yet, he made them the pillars of his Church.

St. Paul, who before his dramatic conversion, tried his very best to uproot the fledging Church by force, considered himself a failure, totally unworthy of any divine favors (cf. 1 Cor. 15:8). Hence, he found plenty of evidence to decipher God's mysterious plan for us: "Consider your own calling, brothers. Not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. Rather, God chose the foolish of the world to shame the wise, and God chose the weak of the world to shame the strong, and God chose the lowly and despised of the world, those who count for nothing, to reduce to nothing those who are something, so that no human being might boast before God.

1 Corinthians 1:26-29

Pondering our past while owning up to our abundant share of mistakes I am certain that none of us would have any trouble concurring with St. Paul's description of God's millennia-tested, *modus operandi*.

Overlooking the countless messes that God's chosen people have made over the millennia and continue to make so frequently, he still wants to need our hearts, our minds, our hands, our feet. The Lord has already factored in our propensity to mess things up for ourselves and others. At times we do it with the best intentions in mind, other times we do it because we can be big-time stinkers!

What happened during the Last Supper in the Upper Room sheds some light on why God decided to create us free. It is so that we can respond with our imperfect love to his perfect love. Hence, even with the foreknowledge of our future failures, Jesus reminds us that we did not choose him, but that he has chosen us to bear lasting fruit. (cf. John 15:16)

It is rather easy to see how God uses the mouth, hands, and heart of a priest to preach his words of life, to assure a penitent of divine forgiveness, to anoint, to bless, to be the extensions of Jesus' body. It is a bit more difficult to see God's action as we nurture each other, encourage each other, embrace each other, bring comfort to each other, visit each other, keep company with a lonely person, lend a helping hand, or listen patiently to stories from a troubled heart. Yet this is what we have been doing every single time we were prompted by love to

reach out and be Jesus Christ to whoever needed his divine closeness in a physical fashion.

By divine decree, all our good deeds done for the Body of Christ acquire the same value as if they were done by Jesus himself. ... and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of his Body, which is the Church, Colossians 1:24

Such is our dignity! We embrace it gladly in view of our eternal reward: "Yes," said the Spirit, "let them find rest from their labors, for their works accompany them." Revelation 14:13



FASTING & ABSTINENCE DURING LENT

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence from meat. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.
