Blessings in Disguise

Dear Parishioners and Friends of San Francesco Church,

As we gain experience from the trials of life, we should reduce the times we get upset and succeed in keeping an even keel even when most people would complain about their misfortunes. We believers should have etched in the back of our mind that we are the adopted children of the Father of all goodness and love. *Consider it all joy, my brothers, when you encounter various trials, for you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. And let perseverance be perfect, so that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing.* **James 1:2-4**

Far from considering trials as sources of joy, those who forget that their lives are in the hands of a Father who is almighty and of infinite love, will curse their fate and fill their heart with resentment and bitterness. Not only that, but they might also make many others feel miserable with them.

Since life can be so challenging and the next serious trial could be just around the corner, it would be wise of us to pause from time to time and recall the "blessings" that started out as very painful and constraining.

Here is a brief list of the most common ones: breaking up with someone, then finding the love of our life; losing a good job only to find a better and more fulfilling one; becoming temporarily disabled and being assisted with much kindness by a person we had judged as being selfish and superficial; an unexpected pregnancy that changed us from being self-centered into a caring, reliable, warm, sweet mom; a debilitating injury that made us discover hidden talents leading to a profitable career; being stranded in a place with extremely limited resources and finding out our real mettle; the list is endless.

In the Bible those cases and countless others are referred to as "being disciplined," as toughening up for future tests. You have also forgotten the exhortation addressed to you as sons: "My son, do not disdain the discipline of the Lord or lose heart when reproved by him; for whom the Lord loves, he disciplines; he scourges every son he acknowledges." Endure your trials as "discipline"; God treats you as sons. For what "son" is there whom his father does not discipline? If you are without discipline, in which all have shared, you are not sons but bastards. Besides this, we have had our earthly fathers to discipline us, and we respected them. Should we not (then) submit all the more to the Father of spirits and live? They disciplined us for a short time as seemed right to them, but he does so for our benefit, in order that we may share his holiness. At the time, all discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain, yet later it brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it. **Hebrews 12:5-11**

If it is true that discipline imparted on us by someone whom we trust can prepare us to successfully handle future challenges, the opposite is also demonstrably true. If we indulge and yield to laziness and apathy, we can grow soft and become ill-prepared for what lies ahead.

There is a fundamental perspective on life which must be imbedded in our mind so that we progress towards becoming productive members of society and accountable members of the Body of Christ. It is the rock-solid, visceral knowledge that nothing in our life and all around us can happen by chance. Whenever faced with suffering, the deeper that conviction is the faster we will shift from the inevitable initial rebellion (innate in all of Adam's descendants) to courageous acceptance. In the Garden of Gethsemane Jesus himself recoiled at the prospect of the impending cruelty of his passion. But the conviction of knowing infinitely well the love that his Father had for him, enabled him to surrender unreservedly. (cf. Luke 22:42)

St. Paul is a splendid example of reading unmistakable signs of the Father's love even in the scariest, most painful events befalling us. "Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of his body, which is the church." **Colossians 1:24**

We are not expected to reach the point of rejoicing in our sufferings, at least not right away; but we are expected to fight against our innate tendency to rebel. The trials of life are depicted by St. Paul as a battle that rages inside us as well as all around us. (cf. Ephesians 6:10ff.; I Thessalonians 5:8).

Looking at our past trials, most likely, we are proud of some of our faith-motivated reactions and embarrassed

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by every time we rebelled. We know that the battle rages on inside and outside. We can read the biographies of any Saint, and, without exception, we will find inspiration from how they embraced their sufferings as blessings; and how those sufferings made them better, more productive members of the Body of Christ. But we also see reactions totally unbecoming of a believer. They range from cursing God and one's cruel destiny to self-pity, bitterness, and making life miserable for those around, to cynicism, despair, and suicide...

Thus, it must be abundantly clear that the battle of turning trials into blessings is a battle that requires the constant assistance of the Holy Spirit and the prayerful support of those who care deeply for us.
