"Lite Catholics" in the Dark

Dear Parishioners and Friends of San Francesco Church,

The approval of Proposal 3 forced me to confront a very sad reality that is a shameful embarrassment for the Catholic Church. I cannot fathom how half of Michiganders, who consider themselves Catholic, could vote in favor of unrestricted access to abortion for the duration of the whole nine months of gestation.

Since neither of the two major parties can offer a completely satisfactory list of priorities to match the concern of citizens and the handling of the most important issues conditioning our country is left lacking, I could understand how Catholics are evenly split between conservatives and liberals.

I attempt here to come up with reasons why 50% of Catholics in our State voted for the right to allow for a personal decision to snuff out human life in the most inhumane methods. Such a decision is so unbecoming of human decency that its proponents must use euphemisms such as "the right to reproductive health" or the "right to choose."

The first faulty reasoning must be due to ignorance of Catholic moral ethics. For over five decades we have been induced slowly to accept circumstances in which choosing to terminate a pregnancy sounds from "not-so-bad" to "reasonable" as the lesser of two evils. How many Catholics feel comfortable with abortion to save the life of the mother? Practically, almost every single one. How many Catholics go along with the decision to abort human life which resulted from rape or incest? The Catechism of the Catholic Church (# 2271-2275) holds that all exceptions must be categorically rejected. The incipient human life doesn't cease to be human life in any of those painful cases; nor does it give up its right to life if a prenatal diagnosis detects anomalies. Diagnosis can never result in a death sentence!

Another reason for voting in favor of Proposal 3 must have been believing the outlandish lies proffered far and wide by most of the media that choosing to defeat

that proposal would be a vote for a total ban on all abortions and even on surgery for ectopic pregnancies. Since the reversal of Roe v. Wade, there has been a monstrous disinformation dissemination of a falsehood: it was hammered into many people's heads that they had to choose either abortion with no restrictions at all for all nine months of gestation or face unavailability of lifesaving healthcare related to pregnancy.

A third reason must have been convenient picking and choosing only what Pope Francis says in agreement with one's frame of reference. For the record, this is what Pope Francis said among other strong statements in condemnation of abortion: "...I would ask this question: is it right to kill human life to solve a problem? Is it right to hire a hitman to kill a human life? That is why the Church is so hard on this issue because, if it accepts this, it would be like accepting daily murder."

Another reason for voting for a sweeping rejection of any restriction on abortion must have been a faulty set of priorities. The Bible is very clear that our Creator God is the Author of all life, human and divine. There cannot be anything more valuable than every life that He calls into existence. All other weighty issues pale by comparison because they all become moot for the human being whose life is snuffed out by a decision made by another human being. The issue of respecting any human life is not an issue to be left to one's personal decision. The American Constitution itself has this enshrined as the first of our unalienable rights...

Pope Francis has been warning us Catholics and all people of goodwill, repeatedly, to snap out of the trap of political polarization because it blurs our vision of the Gospel. For this reason, we have "lite Catholics" on both sides. They are those who are first conservatives or liberals and, then, Catholics on most Sunday mornings. We will never have a well-organized effort to support every single human life whom the Lord calls to be among us until we face with every fiber of our minds and hearts the visit that God made among us. We must embrace wholeheartedly the EVENT which is God-among-us in human flesh.

Reflecting seriously on the Incarnation we are all expected to espouse the sacredness that the Lord has placed in every expression of humanness. This thought

must lead us to a visceral sense of humble gratitude and a commitment to be directly involved in the protection of all human lives: of all mothers including those who were violated in their dignity, all babies including the unwanted, and those with serious prenatal conditions.

As believers, we must refuse to settle for a disengaged "lite" form of Catholicism.

A doubt has been nagging me for the longest time. Catholics who think that the Eucharistic species are not but a symbol of the Body and Blood of Christ are even more numerous than the 50/50 split over Proposal 3. Those who refuse to be "lite Catholics" can make the leap of faith that the Eucharist is truly the flesh of our Lord and God. Hence, it would not be surprising that those in favor of abortion do not recognize the humanity of the flesh in the womb...

One final thought: those who feel compelled to let everybody know that they are practicing Catholics should realize that theirs is an unwarranted affirmation for which no intelligent person falls. Their deeds prove or disprove their faith.
